| 1883 | Born May 18 in Berlin, Germany |
| 1903/07 | Attends Technical University (Architecture Department) in Munich and Berlin |
| 1907 | Educational tour to Spain |
| 1908/10 | Assistant to Peter Behrens |
| 1910 | Private practice in Berlin |
| 1914/18 | Participates in First World War |
| 1915 | Marries Alma-Maria Mahler; divorced 1920. |
| 1919 | Director of the grand-ducal Saxon School of Arts and Crafts and the grand-ducal Saxon School for the Fine Arts. Unifies both institutions under the name, " State Bauhaus in Weimar" |
| 1923 | First extensive exhibition of the Weimar Bauhaus |
| 1923 | Marries Ilse Frank |
| 1925 | Transfer of Bauhaus to Dessau, renamed "Dessau Bauhaus, Academy for Design" |
| 1928 | Resigns Directorship, resumes private practice in Berlin. Visits the United States |
| 1934/37 | Private practice in London, England, in partnership with Maxwell Fry |
| 1937 | Professor of Architecture at the Graduate School of Design, Harvard University, Cambridge, Massachusetts |
| 1938/41 | Private practice in partnership with Marcel Breuer |
| 1938/52 | Chairman of the Department of Architecture, Graduate School of Design, Harvard University |
| 1946/69 | Founding partner and active project principal of The Architects Collaborative (TAC) , Cambridge, Massachusetts |
| 1969 | Dies on July 5 in Boston, Massachusetts |
